

## WHEN:

The project has just started the design phase, with survey work taking place through January 2011. The design phase is estimated to take approximately one year. Two public meetings are planned during the design phase to present the storm drain design and to obtain comments from area residents and business owners. Construction may occur after the design is complete, if funding is available.

## WHY:

The purpose of the storm drain is to mitigate flooding to homes and buildings upstream of the Arizona Canal by capturing stormwater runoff from the 10-year storm within the Arcadia area watershed.

# Lafayette Interceptor Drain and Outlet Project

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## WHAT:

The Lafayette Interceptor Drain and Outlet Project is a new storm drain project in the Arcadia area that is being conducted by the Flood Control District of Maricopa County in partnership with the City of Phoenix.

## WHERE:

The new storm drain segment will connect to the project that is currently under construction on Arcadia Drive south of the Arizona Canal. The proposed storm drain will run north along Arcadia Drive from the Arizona Canal to Lafayette Boulevard, then west along Lafayette Boulevard to 44th Street, and then north along 44th Street to Colter Street. Additionally, catch basins with connector pipes will be designed to collect stormwater and convey it into the main storm drain line.

This project will not change the existing condition of the irrigation ditch and trees along the east side of Arcadia Drive south of Lafayette Boulevard.
