NEW STORM DRAIN TO REDUCE FLOODING POTENTIAL


You are invited to the first open house for the proposed design of a new storm drain project in Arcadia called the Lafayette Interceptor Drain and Outlet. The project is a partnership between the Flood Control District of Maricopa County (District) and the City of Phoenix (City). The design phase commenced in December 2010.

The proposed new storm drain will run along portions of Arcadia Drive, Lafayette Boulevard and 44th Street (see project map). A system of pipes and catch basins will collect rainfall runoff from the 10-year storm and convey it to the storm drain currently under construction on Arcadia Drive south of the Arizona Canal. This storm drain system will be designed to mitigate flooding that affects homes, buildings and streets north of the Arizona Canal.

An effort will be made to preserve Arcadia's visual character during the design of the storm drain system. For example, the storm drain project will not change the existing condition of the irrigation ditch and trees along the east side of Arcadia Drive south of Lafayette Boulevard.

The project design phase will continue until the end of 2011. Two public meetings are planned during this phase. Construction may occur after the design is complete, if funding is available.
