## Flood Control Responsibilities

Homeowners

- \* Floods controlled: Drainage on own property (backyard to front yard)
- \* Must adhere to HOA and city building regulations
- \* Ensures that changes made on property do not adversely impact neighbors

Homeowners Associations

- \* Floods controlled: Local facilities within the community (1-100 yr. floods)
- \* Maintains development built to protect community such as drainage channels and basins
- \* Sets and enforces community building regulations

Cities & Towns

- \* Floods controlled: Street-level/drainage floods within city limits (1-100 yr. floods)
- \* Partners with Flood Control on studies and projects
- \* Builds and maintains structures
- \* Sets and enforces building standards and reviews new development to ensure safety from 100-year floods

Flood Control District

- \* Floods controlled: Regional, large flood events (10-100 yr. floods)
- \* Large projects (dams, basins, channels)
- \* Partners with state, county and local government on projects
- \* Works with FEMA, Army Corps of Engineers and other federal agencies
- \* Adopts and enforces floodplain regulations
