



### Presumptive Permission to Burn

Once the Maricopa County Air Quality Department (MCAQD) has inspected the burn site and a burn permit is issued, you will have the permission to burn as long as the following four steps are followed:

1. Check the MCAQD website at [Maricopa.gov/AQ](http://Maricopa.gov/AQ) to determine if a High Pollution Advisory (HPA) or No Burn Day has been declared. If a HPA or No Burn Day has been declared, you may not burn on that day.
2. Call your local fire department or dispatcher center and notify them of your intent to burn. If they do not give permission to burn, you may not burn on that day.
3. Review and comply with the requirements of Rule 314. Be sure to comply with the prohibited dates and schedule listed on the Burn Permit Application.
